PATRIOT DAY

It is a US national observance that honors the memory of those who were killed in the 11 September 2001 attacks. It was first observed in 2002, after a proclamation by President George W. Bush.



Initially, the President proclaimed 14 September 2001 as a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance. However, in 2002, 11 September was made the National Day of Mourning referred to as Patriot Day. A moment of silence is traditionally observed at 8:46 AM.
